

# Yogi gives mantra of fruitful career to trainee IAS officers

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, on Friday, gave the young officers who joined the Indian Administrative Service the mantra of “communication, coordination, and positivity” for a fruitful career.

Interacting with 16 officers of the UP cadre of the IAS 2021 batch, the chief minister said, “Becoming an essential part of the administration of a large state like Uttar Pradesh is filled with significant challenges, and these challenges will shape your personality. As an IAS officer, you will have the responsibility of working from joint magistrates to the highest positions in government and formulating policies. On such occasions, you should have a sense of public welfare in your mind.”

He further guided the young officers to feel connected with the public during their field assignments. The chief minister emphasised that the



147 5-6 years of their work will pave the way for their career for the next 30-35 years. He asked the young officers to work with a positive attitude and gain the trust of the people. The chief minister further said, “During your transfers, if people are saddened by your departure, understand that you are moving in the right direction.” Referring to various events in the state, the chief minister stated that after training, on the first posting as joint magistrate there would also be revenue matters and an opportunity to handle law and order. “Currently, there are thousands of pending revenue cases, and people are awaiting swift

justice, and you can fulfill their expectations,” he added.

Emphasising the importance of communication in matters of law and order, the chief minister said that no matter how large the crowd or how intense the anger was, if there was proper communication, then every problem could be solved.

Officers who had been deployed in positions such as BDO, sub-collector and CDPO in districts such as Ayodhya, Kanpur, Hardoi, Rae Bareilly, Moradabad, Agra, Saharanpur, Azamgarh, Jhansi, Mathura, Gorakhpur, Varanasi, etc. also shared their experiences during the dialogue. These young offi-

cers, who are now prepared for phase II of their training, not only discussed the challenges of their respective districts but also acquainted the chief minister with the innovations they had introduced.

The chief minister mentioned that in this vast state with a population of 25 crore, 18 divisions and 75 districts, every district poses its own challenges. “Understanding and facing them as administrative officers is your responsibility,” he said. The chief minister stated that, as officers, bringing positive change to the lives of the common people was a noble endeavour that should be pursued effectively.

# Ram Mandir trust reserves three dates for consecration ceremony

The Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust has proposed holding the consecration ceremony of the Ram Lalla idol on January 21, 22, or 23 next year, a trust member said on Friday. The trust members had earlier said they would be sending an official invite to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the event.

“The consecration ceremony of Ram Janmabhoomi will take place in the third week of January next year. Three dates — 21, 22, and 23 of January — have been fixed for the consecration ceremony. We will invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the ceremony which will also be attended by prominent sadhus and other dignitaries,” the trust’s

General Secretary Champat Rai told PTI.

“The main event would be kept non-political. Guests from different political parties will also be invited, provided they have the intention to come. There will be no stage in the programme nor any public meeting,” he said.

The trust plans to invite over 25,000 Hindu religious leaders of 136 Sanatan traditions for the ceremony. A list of such saints is being prepared by the temple trust and soon an invitation letter will be sent to them with the signature of trust president Mahant Nritya Gopal Das, he said.

“The trust has planned to accommodate all prominent leaders in the big monasteries of Ayodhya,” Rai said.

These 25,000 saints will be

separate from 10,000 “special guests” who will attend the consecration ceremony inside the premise of Ram Janmabhoomi. The Bhoomi Pujan programme for temple was held on August 5, 2020 on a very limited scale due to the COVID-19 guidelines.

“The sanctum sanctorum of Ram Lalla is nearing completion. Now in the month of January the preparation for the grand event of ‘Pran Pratishtha’ is on in full swing,” said Anil Misra, a temple trust member. The trust is planning to provide free food for about a month to the devotees coming for the consecration ceremony in Ayodhya.

According to Rai, the trust would be feeding 75,000-1,00,000 people every day for the whole of January.

# Gov urges girl students to become empowered

Lucknow (PNS): Governor Anandiben Patel participated as chief guest in the awareness and HPV vaccination programme for prevention of cervical cancer at Dr Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences on Friday.

The governor distributed awareness posters regarding prevention of cervical cancer to the teachers of Kasturba Gandhi Residential Girls’ School. She also distributed awareness booklets and nutritional food to girl students.

A memorandum of understanding was signed between Johns Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynaecology and Obstetrics Corporation, India, and RMLIMS to strengthen the health systems and quality of women cancer care in UP.

Expressing happiness over the presence of students of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya in the programme, the governor encouraged them to become empowered. About her recent visits to Jalaun and Hamirpur district hospitals for inspection, the governor said that low birth weight of newborns is a matter of concern and needs to be addressed.

She said it is necessary to take care of the girls’ nutrition. The governor said that it is necessary to acquire qualities like learning, teaching, cooperating with each other, bringing harmony in the family from a young age. Millets and nutritious food should be included in the mid-day meal in schools, she added. The governor said that eradication of cervical cancer is possible not only by vaccination but also by good behaviour, nutritious food and regular exercise.

She said efforts should be made towards eradication of cervical cancer by organising various competitive programmes like painting, speech and other creative works in the school. Girl students were also invited to the Raj Bhavan for a speech competition on cancer eradication under a competitive environment.

Deputy Chief Minister Brajesh Pathak thanked the governor for efforts made in the context of cervical cancer and vaccination and also appreciated the innovative efforts made by her in the field of education.

The programme was also addressed by expert doctors, who expressed their views regarding awareness of cervical cancer and HPV vaccination. Cervical cancer is considered to be the second most common cancer among Indian women and 80 per cent of the cases are related to HPV infection. The HPV vaccine is 95 per cent effective against this type of cancer and has minimal side effects.

# Surgery for generalised dystonia performed

The department of neurology and neurosurgery, Dr Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, successfully performed a surgical procedure on a 21-year-old girl with generalised dystonia. “Dystonia is a type of movement disorder that causes abnormal twists or postures in body parts due to muscle spasms. When it affects multiple areas of the body, it is called generalised dystonia. It can be due to genetic reasons or can also be caused by brain infection, head injury, degenerative (dystonia) brain diseases, etc.

The 21-year-old patient was referred from a private hospital in Sitapur district to RMLIMS. She had been suffering from dystonia since childhood and her symptoms were not improving.

Dr Dinkar Kulshrestha explained that medical management with drugs had failed to control her dystonia and toxin injection was not a therapeutic option as the disease affected multiple muscle groups. Neurosurgery consultation was done and surgical options were discussed by Dr Deepak Kumar Singh. Due to financial issues, pallidotomy

was considered. Since this was the first time that this surgical procedure was planned, senior neurosurgeon from Artemis Hospital (Gurugram) Dr Sanjeev Srivastava was asked for assistance during the surgical procedure. Holes were made in the skull and a stereotactic head frame was placed. Using CT scans and MRIs of the head and frames, precise 3-D localisation of the site to create the hole was chosen.

The holes were made through wires inserted into the brain region and connected to a radiofrequency pulse generator. These high-frequency waves caused holes to be made in the globus pallidus (pallidotomy). The surgery lasted for about 7-8 hours.

Dr Deepak Singh said that the condition of the patient was stable after the operation and she was discharged after two days. The total cost of the surgery was around Rs 1.2 lakh. The patient was operated upon in the middle of April and since the effects of the surgery are visible in 3-6 months after the procedure, the patient is regularly consulting Dr Ajay Singh and Dr Dinkar. There has been improvement in walking and flexing the arms.

# Pvt schools to remain closed on August 8

Lucknow (PNS): All private schools in Uttar Pradesh, regardless of the boards (CBSE, ICSE, UP Board, or any other), will remain closed on August 8, Tuesday. The closure is in protest against the incident at an Azamgarh school, as well as the subsequent arrest of the principal and a teacher.

President of Unaided Private Schools’ Association Anil Agarwal stated that the symbolic protest aims to ensure a thorough investigation into the case. “If the individuals involved are found guilty, appropriate actions must be applied. However, any misguided actions taken by students should also be subjected to a comprehensive inquiry,” Agarwal said.

He noted that although a student was found in possession of a mobile phone, it was important to highlight that it was provided by the parents and not the school. Despite schools explicitly prohibiting mobile phones on campus, some parents disregard this rule, he pointed out.

Agarwal pointed out that parents today are quick to threaten legal action even for minor issues, making it challenging to communicate effectively.

# Youth stabs girl for rejecting proposal

Lucknow (PNS): A youth allegedly attempted to murder a 22-year old girl on Thursday afternoon. Meera daughter of late Munna Lal Lodhi. She was identified as Meera, a resident of Chakkar Purwa locality in Paper Mill Colony under Mahanagar police station. The accused, identified as Sonu of the same locality, allegedly stabbed her twice as she was not ready to marry him. Police said that the accused proposed to the girl but she declined her proposal. He was arrested on Friday.

Earlier, police were informed about the incident and the girl was rushed to a

nearby private nursing home. She was referred to KGMU Trauma Centre.

Meanwhile, police claimed to have busted a gang of auto-lifters. Those arrested were identified as Jitendra Kumar (25) and Baldev Singh (32), both of Lakhimpur Kheri district. Five stolen motorcycles were found from their possession. The police said that the accused were nabbed as they tried to escape after taking a U-turn to avoid checking near Sangam crossing under Aliganj police station. They told the police that they were running away as they had country-made pistols.

During interrogation, they disclosed that they had come to Lucknow about three weeks ago and were conducting recce before striking.

In another case, police claimed to have arrested a chain-snatcher and recovered two gold chains and a stolen motorcycle from his possession. He was identified as Ajay Kumar Gautam (28). He was rounded up in Rajajipuram in connection with a complaint filed by Atul Gupta, a resident of the same locality. Police said the gold chain of Ajay’s wife Anjana Gupta was snatched on July 29 evening.

# Minor gang-raped in Deoria; 1 held

Lucknow (PNS): A 14-year-old girl was allegedly gang-raped by three men in Deoria, police said on Friday.

Based on the complaint of the girl’s mother, a rape case has been registered against three youths and one of them has been arrested, the police added.

According to the woman, her daughter was on the way to her school on Thursday and had reached the culvert outside her village around 8 am when three men caught hold of her and took her to an adjacent sugarcane field where they took turns to rape her, Tarkulwa Station House Officer Dilip Singh said.

The Class 10 student’s family members also alleged that the accused filmed her while raping the girl and posted it on social media, however, no proof of such a video was found so far, the SHO said.

A medical examination of the victim was conducted and her statement was recorded in the court on Friday.

Circle Officer (CO) Shreyas Tripathi said the preliminary investigation suggested that the girl was allegedly in a relationship with one of the accused. A case of gang-rape has been registered and one person has been arrested, the CO said, adding that further investigation is underway.

# Fire breaks out at disaster mgmt authority office

A fire broke out at the office of the Uttar Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority here on Friday, officials said. Office equipment, furniture and computers were gutted, they said, adding that a seven-member committee has been constituted to probe the incident. Authority’s Additional Chief Executive Officer Ram Kewal said the fire broke out at around 6.30 am and was caused by an electrical short circuit. The process of assessment of damage is underway, he added. The office is located in Picup Bhawan of Vibhuti Khand of Lucknow.
