

UP plays key role in shaping India's unique global identity: Dhankhar

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar hailed Uttar Pradesh as a shining example of progress, saying it plays a key role in shaping India's unique global identity and every citizen will have to make a sacrifice in the 'Developed India' mission.

Vice President Dhankhar was addressing the inauguration ceremony of Sainik School in Gorakhpur on Saturday. In his address, he called upon citizens to actively participate in the ongoing campaign for realising the vision of a 'Developed India' by 2047.

He said, "Every person should make sacrifices for the 'Developed India Mission' because no sacrifice is too great when it comes to serving the country."

Hailing Uttar Pradesh as a shining example of progress, the vice president commended Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath for the significant transformations witnessed in the state since 2017. He said that Uttar Pradesh had made a qualitative contribution in the distinct and strong identity of India in the world.

He praised the transformative changes in Uttar Pradesh under the leadership of Chief Minister Yogi, noting significant advancements in education, healthcare, entrepreneurship and other sectors since 2017. He remarked: "Indianness is our identity, and the nation is our religion."

He urged everyone to prioritise national interests above personal ones, warning that any compromise with nationalism would be a betrayal to the country. He asserted that those who question the nation's integrity would not be tolerated. The vice president highlighted the dramatic change in Kashmir, where, following the abolition of Article 370, more than two crore tourists have visited the region over the past two to three years. He reminded the audience that while the framers of the Constitution intended Article 370 to be temporary, some mistakenly viewed it as permanent. Vice President Dhankhar also praised Purvanchal as a vital region of Uttar Pradesh, commending the construction of the first Sainik School in the area. He exuded confidence that the school will play a crucial role in shaping future generations, standing as a testament to Chief Minister Yogi's unique vision and impact.

Gorakhpur (PTI): Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday inaugurated the Sainik School in Gorakhpur in the presence of Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar and said that Gorakhpur is progressing rapidly under the inspiration and guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Addressing the inauguration programme, Adityanath said that Gorakhpur has become the dream destination for education, health and investment in the region. "Today the sacred purpose of building generations is fulfilled through Sainik School. This is an important day for eastern Uttar Pradesh," he said. Adityanath said that Gorakhpur has been an important place mythologically and historically. It is the place of worship of Mahayogi Guru Gorakhnath ji and also the centre for the publication of Sanatan literature all over the world through Gita Press. In the fight for freedom, during the first freedom struggle of 1857, under the leadership of Shaheed Bandhu Singh, the foundations of British rule

The vice president recalled that the country's first Sainik School was founded in Lucknow in 1960 by then-Chief Minister Dr Sampurnanand. "Now, decades later, Chief Minister Yogi

were shaken in the Gorakhpur region. The historic incident of Chauri Chaura in 1922 gave new impetus to the freedom struggle. Adityanath said that the Sainik School of Gorakhpur, which was completed in a short period of three years, will play an important role in shaping the future of upcoming generations. This Sainik School will build future generations and will prove helpful in making them understand the duties of life, he said and added that students passing out from this institute will pave the way for a developed India in future. The first Sainik School in the country was established in Lucknow in 1960 by the then Chief Minister Sampurnanand. After that, in 1961, the then-defence minister also started five new Sainik Schools. Welcoming the Vice President, he said: "It is our pleasure that this Sainik School is being inaugurated by Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, an alumnus of Chittorgarh Sainik School during the period 1962 to 1969."

Adityanath has surpassed that legacy, setting a new benchmark by swiftly establishing another Sainik School," he stated.

The vice president shared an emotional moment, recounting

the day when Chief Minister Yogi personally visited his residence to extend an invitation for the inauguration of Sainik School Gorakhpur. He described the invitation as extraordinary, noting that Chief Minister Yogi's attention to detail and thoughtfulness were evident in how he invited him not just as a dignitary, but as an alumnus of a Sainik School. Reflecting on the inauguration ceremony, the vice president expressed how the event brought back vivid memories of his own time as a Sainik School student six decades ago. He described the experience as unforgettable, noting that Chief Minister Yogi's efforts had created an indelible moment in his life.

He emphasised that this invitation also served as a reminder of the transformative power of education, which has the ability to bridge inequalities and foster change.

The vice president lauded the newly established institution, expressing his belief that it will serve as an inspiration for other states to form similar societies and establish Sainik Schools of their own. He emphasised that the bond he has formed with Gorakhpur through this event will remain with him for life.

He reflected on his own connection to the region, recalling the time he served in the Lok Sabha alongside Yogi Adityanath's mentor, Mahant Avidyanath, from whom he received blessings when he became a minister at the Centre.

Following the inauguration of the Sainik School Gorakhpur, Vice President Dhankhar inspected the new institution. He toured the school's facilities, including classrooms, playgrounds, the swimming pool, and the residential complex. He also tried his hand at shooting at the newly established Eklavya Shooting Range. In a gesture reflecting his commitment to environmental sustainability, the vice president planted trees on the school grounds, sending a strong message about the importance of keeping nature green and maintaining a clean and beautiful environment.

The day's events commenced with the National Anthem and Saraswati Vandana as the vice president took the stage. The highlight of the ceremony was an emotional drama staged by the cadets, depicting the transition from student life to military service.

Lucknow ranks 4th in Swachh Vayu Survekshan

Lucknow has achieved the fourth place in the Swachh Vayu Survekshan rankings, results of which were announced on Saturday. The city was evaluated in the category for cities with populations exceeding 10 lakh. Notably, Lucknow was not part of last year's survey. Municipal Commissioner Inderjit Singh emphasised the need for further improvements. "While this ranking is an achievement, there is still much

work to be done. We need enhanced interdepartmental coordination to address the areas where we lost marks," Singh stated.

One key area of focus is the promotion of electric vehicles. Singh noted, "We lost points in this category due to the low number of electric vehicles in the city. Increasing their adoption among the public is crucial."

Air pollution in Lal Bagh area is another concern. "Traffic congestion in this area significantly impacts air quality,

Decongesting this area will help improve the situation," Singh added. The city has made progress in managing legacy waste, with processing underway at the Shivri plant.

Approximately 18.5 lakh MT of legacy waste needs treatment on Mohan Road. Singh also pointed out that construction activities have contributed to dust and deteriorated air quality, particularly on Kanpur and Dubagga roads. "End-to-end pavements will help mitigate dust and further

enhance air quality," he said. The Swachh Vayu Survekshan is an initiative by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, which ranks cities based on their air quality and cleanliness.

The top three cities in each category receive awards, including a cash prize, trophy, and a 'National Clean Air City' certificate. This recognition is part of the National Mission for Clean Air, awarded on September 7 in celebration of the International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skies.

UP accords top priority to women-related issues

Lucknow (PNS): The Uttar Pradesh government has claimed that it has accorded top priority to empowering women with respect and their safety, positioning the state at the forefront of addressing women-related issues nationwide. The Uttar Pradesh Women Power Line (1090) is a major contributor to this success. According to 2023 data from the helpline, the department has successfully translated Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's vision into action, achieving a 100 per cent resolution rate for women's complaints. Over the past 19 months, more than six lakh complaints have been addressed within the designated time frame. Specifically, in 2023, 4,09,433 out of 4,09,434 complaints were resolved, with just one default call. As of August 30, 2024, 83.92 per cent of the cases have been addressed, with the remaining complaints on track for resolution within the stipulated time. As many as 3,04,481 calls were registered during this period, of which 2,55,535 were resolved. Women Power Line ADG Padmaja Chauhan stated that in alignment with Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's directives, complaints about women are being addressed on a priority basis, with immediate assistance being provided when needed. She highlighted that in 2023, an average of 1,122 complaints were resolved daily, with a significant number of 1,70,734 complaints successfully addressed through counselling. Additionally, FIRs were registered in 62,667 cases. To ensure prompt assistance, all remaining calls were forwarded to relevant departments.

Principal Secretary, Jail, removed

Lucknow (PNS): The Uttar Pradesh government on Saturday removed Principal Secretary, Jail, Rajesh Kumar Singh following the adverse comments by the Supreme Court. He has been kept in the waiting list. Anil Garg has replaced Rajesh Kumar Singh. MP Agarwal has been posted as Principal Secretary, Cooperatives, and Venkateshwar Lu as in-charge of Rural Development Institute, Lucknow. The Supreme Court had warned of contempt action against officers in the office of chief minister's secretariat on August 12, and sought to know the names of those officials who had refused to accept files of remission pleas of convicted prisoners due to enforcement of model code of conduct during the Lok Sabha elections. Remission is the cancellation or

reduction of a part of the prison sentence of a prisoner. Under Section 432 of the CrPC, state governments may remit the whole or part of the punishment to which a convict has been sentenced based on factors such as the prisoner's conduct, rehabilitation, health and time served in the prison.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih expressed its displeasure over the state government not processing files related to remission pleas within the specified time frame despite its order.

Sugar mills of Baghpat, Muzaffarnagar set for expansion

In a significant move to boost the sugarcane industry, the Yogi Adityanath government is prioritising the modernisation and expansion of sugar mills in Uttar Pradesh. The government has laid out a plan to upgrade the sugar mills in Baghpat and Muzaffarnagar, aiming to enhance their efficiency and technological capabilities, ensuring maximum benefits for the state's sugarcane farmers.

The initiative was discussed in a high-level meeting chaired by Chief Secretary Manoj Kumar Singh, in which the state government proposed an investment of Rs 84.77 crore for the modernisation and marginal expansion of Kisan Sahakari Sugar Mill in Baghpat.

The project involves increasing the mill's crushing capacity from 2,500 TCD to 3,000 TCD, with the financial arrangement comprising 50 per cent share capital from the state government and 50 per cent as a loan. The government has allocated Rs 65 crore in the 2024-25 budget for this purpose. The modernisation is essential due to the ample availability of sugarcane in the mill's command area, with expectations of crushing about 5.01 lakh tonnes in the next five years, up from the current 4.82 lakh tonnes.

Similarly, a proposal to invest Rs 88.02 crore for the expansion and technical upgrade of Ganga Kisan Sahkari Sugar Mill Ltd. in Morna, Muzaffarnagar, was also discussed. This mill will also see an increase in crushing capacity from 2,500 TCD to 3,000 TCD. The financial strategy mirrors that of the Baghpat mill, with the state government providing 50 per cent of the funds as share capital and the remaining 50 per cent as a loan. The modernisation will enable the mill to crush up to 5.40 lakh tonnes of sugarcane over the next five years, compared to the current 4.85 lakh tonnes. These upgrades are expected to bring significant benefits, including reduced steam and power consumption, timely crushing of sugarcane, bagasse savings, and improved sugar recovery.

Girl killed as truck hits schoolgoers

Rae Bareilly: A 16-year-old girl lost her life and two other teenagers were injured here on Saturday morning when they were hit by a truck, while they were on their way to school on their bicycles, police said. Angered over the incident, the victims' family members, villagers, and the school's students staged a sit-in protest. According to the police, the accident took place near Pyarepur turn in Salon police station area of Raebareilly district. Shaifila died on the spot, while two other girls -- Kanchan (17) and Aarti (16) -- got injured and were admitted to the district hospital, they said. The victims were students of a government-aided school in Raebareilly, they added. Family members of the girls and villagers started protesting on the Raebareilly-Pratapgarh road. A large number of girl students of the school also joined them and sat on the road in protest, the police said.
